Something new we are going to give a try is called "You Earned It!" Children will put a sticker up for every week they attend, and after 13 straight weeks of attendance, they will be awarded a new Bible or T-shirt. They will be given one free space to use during those 13 weeks, because we all get sick! Their award will be presented to them during Sunday morning worship services while the children are still in the Sanctuary, so that everyone can congratulate them. I see this as a way to encourage children to worship every Sunday, and to reward those that do.

Another new idea the Lord has put on my heart is a "Me, You and God" banquet.
