VOTE FOR JESUS!

Greetings Church! Love you Church! I praise God for who you are in Christ and the love you show each other and to all! Even those who have not yet been able to join us in person the last few (too many) months are not far from the thoughts and hearts of those who can gather and we all look forward to the day when we no longer have this "plandemic" hanging over our heads. I have a sneaky suspicion it will be over November 4.

Speaking of politics, I am quite sure you have noticed the political overtones in my sermon series, The Gospel to Our Culture, as I seek to shine the light of the Gospel of Jesus Christ upon the issues plaguing our culture today. While you may not agree with my exact political leanings, I take the risk of offending everyone because the political arena has our land's attention these days. Unfortunately, far too many people are looking to our government to right the wrongs in our land. That hope is ill-placed. I have said for years that Washington is broken and powerless. They are very powerful to do as they want but powerless to do as they ought. The power they lack is only found in Jesus Christ. He is THE hope for our land and THE solution for our ills. I use analysis of our political environment to pave the way for the proclamation of the Gospel. I will explain more of my motivation in the sermons coming the next few weeks, so be sure to listen online if you can't join us in person. I hope you will find it inspiring on several levels. By the way, I hope you are sharing them with people you know (even if you don't agree with my political comments) so that the Gospel can go forth.

Sir Edmund Burke once said, "The only thing necessary for evil to triumph is for good people to do nothing." As I said in my first sermon of this series, most of the blame for our nation's dark state is



on the Church's failings to get the Gospel to our neighbors, public square, and culture. One major area of failure is with our voting. So many people who identify with the name of Christ have left their faith in truth and righteousness at the door of the polling place. Rather than voting on principles grounded in God's Word, they pull the lever (or dent the chad or partially fill in the oval) (Eek!) based on party loyalty, tradition, self-service, issue-ignorance, popularity, or (worst of all) a separation of personal politics from the principles of Christ. Tragically, some Godly people don't even vote because they either think theirs does not matter or that they should not participate because they are citizens of a greater Kingdom. Good people doing nothing, or the wrong thing.

I hope that will not be the case for our church family. I will be providing voter registration forms in the days to come and voter guides as the election gets close so that we can have informed voters going to the polls to vote their Christian conscience. I can't wait to vote all three times! (Kidding!!)

I know that sometimes no choice on the ballot comes very close to promoting the truth and righteousness of God and His Word. In those cases, considerations must be made about which vote gives the most momentum for the possibility for truth and righteousness to succeed. I, too, have had

to hold my nose and vote for someone I view as the least bad option. It is a sickening and hopeless feeling IF I am only depending on man to fix our problems. I want to at least vote for the people who uphold liberty so that the Gospel of Christ may continue to go forth freely in our land.

We must always approach our citizen duty through faith in the King of Kings, knowing that Christ is Lord of All, no matter the results of an election. He raises rulers for His purposes which include blessing or punishing a people or nation, the protection of the good public, and the punishment of wrongdoers. We need Christ more than any politician. So let us seek Him together as we do our best to preserve this best, last bastion of freedom in our world.
