### Pastor's Pen

### Moms in Recovery

Greetings Church! Love You Church! Love you Moms too!

Moms play one of the most important roles in our lives. They are given to us by God to nurture and develop us according to His plan for our lives. Sometimes moms do a pretty good job. Sometimes they don't do the job at all. Either way, our lives are greatly impacted by the choices they make, for both the better and the worse. And sometimes we have some issues to work through because of the impact they have on us.

The mother's job is not easy and sometimes they aren't up for the task. They deal with some of the most heartbreaking challenges that face their children. Often those challenges are economic: how will we have enough money to keep our house, feed our children, put shoes on their feet? Often, those challenges are the result of foolish choices fathers have made yet force Mom and the kids to live in the wake of damage from those choices.

There is one such Mom in the Bible who doesn't often get talked about. She doesn't get much attention as a great example of a Mother because she appears to have failed. She bailed. She gave up. She allowed her circumstance and challenges to overcome her. Her story of failure, though, points us to a God who brought awareness and recovery to this broken mother.

Hagar was an Egyptian servant of Sarai who was married to Abram. Hagar became the victim of the couple's sinful, faithless actions. She was sexually and physically abused, became pregnant, and was then abandoned. You see, God had promised Abram and Sarai that they would have a son. But they were never able to have children and were now over 80 years old! They struggled to believe such an illogical miracle would come to pass, so they faithlessly took matters into their own hands. Sarai suggested that Abram sleep with her younger, fertile servant Hagar hoping God would allow Sarai to build a family through her as a surrogate. Abram faithlessly agreed and they forced him upon Hagar sexually. She did, in fact, conceive a son. However, rather than being a cause for jubilation, the news of Hagar's pregnancy made Sarai bitter and jealous and she despised her fertile servant. Sarai began abusing

Hagar so she fled for her life. But in her troubles, God met her and worked in her.

The angel of the Lord found Hagar near a spring in the desert, called her by name, and asked her where she was from and where was she going. She was running away from her troubles. How often do we do the same thing? We feel as if the moment of stress, pressure, pain, guilt, humiliation, embarrassment, etc. is too much for us to handle faithfully so we run. We hide. We try to find a place where we can be away from other eyes so we can avoid our troubles. But such a place rarely provides healing or help. Our relationships certainly suffer. So where can we find help?

The good news is, that even when we have isolated ourselves, God can still find us there. He pursued Hagar. He sent her back to deal with her abuser and her troubles. Cruel? No. Because God made her a promise to take care of her and her baby. So Hagar gave God a name. "You are the LORD who sees me." What a powerful recognition for our healing: "God sees me!" Even if I feel all alone. Even if I am hiding. Even if all I can see is my pain, God sees me. He knows where I am. He knows where I have been and knows all of my troubles. And He knows that where I am going will get me nowhere unless I follow Him.

So Hagar returns home and finds a wonderful, warm welcome. Right? Wrong! Although God promised to take care of her and her son, Sarai miraculously did become pregnant when Hagar's son, Ishmael, was 13 or 14 years old. At a feast for Isaac's weaning, Sarah, the mother of the miracle baby, saw that her child of promise was being mocked by his competitor. Sarah made Abraham send Hagar and Ishmael away. So, with only a little food and a skin of water, Hagar and Ishmael were cast out to wander the desert alone. When the water was gone, she put her him under a bush and went off by herself because she could not bear to watch her son die. She sat there and sobbed. But again, God saw her. He heard Ishmael crying and He sent His angel to her again. He saw her plight,

recognized her pain, reassured her faith with a renewed promise, and opened her eyes to see a well of water that "The God who sees" was providing for them.

Take heart dear one! God has promised not to abandon you! He is a good Father who cares faithfully for His children! Perhaps people in your life have abused or abandoned you. Perhaps you have felt left to die alone. Take heart! God sees you. He isn't looking at your troubles nearly as much as you are. He chooses instead to look at you and His promises to you. He invites you to open your eyes to see His provision for His promises in your life as well. Your eyes will have to lift from your troubles to set upon the place where He is pointing you. The place of provision. The place of healing. The place of peace.

Celebrate Recovery offers the roadmap to that place. We have been looking at this road for the last several Sunday mornings. Will you start walking this road, trusting Jesus all the way? He sees you. He knows where you have been. But do you know the place of peace, freedom and healing yet? Let us help! We who are walking this road want to invite you to join us. We meet **Tuesday nights at 6:30** at the church. You are welcome to join us regardless of the magnitude or the makeup of your hurt, habit or hang-up. Won't you join us? Pastor David Crook

## **Operation Christmas Child**

Hello church family! God is so good! Here is another story of how God is using these shoeboxes (gospel opportunities) that we pack to spread the good news to a no-go zone.

We saw God work mightily among another unreached people group. The village of Gongonbili, where the Lobi people live in Burkina Faso, was considered a "no-go zone" for the Gospel, due to its reputation for violence against outsiders and its open hostility to Christianity. But "with God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26) and local leaders allowed shoeboxes to be given out to the area children.

"The parents were delighted that someone had thought of bringing gifts to their children and showing them the love of God. They even asked for prayer for themselves," a ministry partner said. "Today, over 30 adults and 50 children attend a new church that was started in the village. God broke into this no-go zone, and now it's a go zone for the Gospel!"

Thank you for your prayers for us as we have been adjusting to life and ministry here. We miss all of you and are excited about the things we hear are happening there, too. May the Lord use the Celebrate Recovery group to help many, many people live in freedom through Christ, and the grief group to minister to hurting hearts. Isn't it such a gift from God that a relationship with Jesus and connection to His body and those who understand what we're going through can be so encouraging and supportive at the times we really need to know He is present in our lives?

We'd like to share a few praises and prayer requests: We praise God that He is helping us learn the language. Mark is preaching in Kiswahili now with help to work on his sermons with his language helper. Melynda is beginning to work specifically on words and phrases that will help her be better equipped to serve children with special needs and their families. Please pray our language ability will continue progressing. Being able to fully understand and contribute to daily conversations and share the reason for the hope that we have in Jesus is what we long to be able to do.

Madylanne is in her last term of 9th grade, Matthew is in year 6 (5th grade in the US) and Micah is in year 2 (1st grade). They all finish up their school year in July. They really enjoy their schools and having friends and social/sports activities. We are grateful they have good schools, good friends, and good teachers. This has been a year of adjustment for everyone and they've done a great job transitioning.

Seasonal rains have begun here which is good because much of the country is in drought. We are so grateful to God that there is some rain. Please ask the Lord to send lots of rain, especially in the places where it is most needed.

We ask that you pray for a man here who is dying of cancer. His sister became a follower of Jesus almost 20 years ago and has been sharing Christ with him ever since. God has granted him additional days that no one thought he would have... and now his body is slowly being overtaken by the cancer. Yet he remains firm in his belief that his good works will be enough for him to stand before Allah. Please pray for a softening of his heart and that he will see his need for Jesus. His days left on this earth are few.

Many people have said yes to Jesus over the last few months and we praise God for this! It is amazing to see God working in people's hearts, drawing them to Himself. We pray now for good follow up and discipleship so that these new brothers and sisters in Christ will grow in their faith and connect well with local churches.

We see many struggling marriages here and this is something we would like to ask you to pray about, too. We would like to be able to have a marriage retreat in the year ahead and we pray the Lord will show us how to partner with local churches to reach the most people- first with the good news of Jesus, and second with His good news that He can help hurting marriages.
