Young Central Asian Shepherds Receive Shoebox Gifts

A simple drive through the countryside can become something special. Yusif*, a volunteer leader in Central Asia with Operation Christmas Child, was traveling with several team members to a ministry meeting when he spotted two shepherd boys tending their flock near the highway. Remembering that he had some gift-filled shoeboxes as well as copies of The Greatest Gift Gospel booklet with him, Yusif stopped the car. While this was not a typical outreach event, he and his team members felt compelled to pause in their travel, encourage the boys, and bless them in a special

"Did you want something, sir?" asked the youngest boy in a rather grown-up tone. "Why did you stop here?" Yusif explained that God wanted him to give a gift and

a small book about His Son, Jesus Christ, to these two brothers, ages 5 and 7. "Why in the world do you want to give me this box?" the younger one inquired again. Though just 5, he talked—and rode his donkey—like an adult. "This is just a gift for you from God, who loves you and wants to show His love through this gift," Yusif said. The boy took the shoebox gift, pressed it to his chest, and turned to look toward his older brother who was tending the flock a distance away. Yusif noticed his concerned glance and assured him

that there was a gift for his brother, too. The boy then called to his sibling who quickly came riding toward them.

Bringing Joy to Those Working Hard to Survive

Yusif grabbed a shoebox gift and a copy of The Greatest Gift and went to meet the older brother. Opening the booklet, he started reading to the boy and explained that more than 100 countries. Ask God to the Lord created the world including mankind—because of His great love. Yusif gave him the shoebox gift and said, "This gift is a sign of His affection to you—He loves you."

The older boy took the box and held it tight, much like his younger brother had done with his. Then, the younger one began to read the booklet as he sat atop his donkey. "The boys got excited because no one ever gave them gifts," Yusif said. "In this region, even young boys have to work hard to survive." He explained that parents expect much of their children, entrusting the care of large flocks to them, despite the threat of wild animals and people with evil intent. "The Lord sent us into their reality to say that He loves them," Yusif said.

The team prayed over these boys as they left. Later, they prayed again that a seed was planted that would grow in the hearts of the young shepherds. Now, Yusif continues to pray that he will see the boys when he goes that way again, and he also asks God to help him drive slower so he will notice more people like them.

"Many thanks to Samaritan's Purse for taking care of the children in need, so that they would come to know the love of God," Yusif said.

"It's wonderful that, through these gifts and books written in the children's heart language, they can find out how dear they are in the sight of God and that there is hope for eternal life with Him."

Please pray for national teams worldwide, who, like this one in Central Asia, help proclaim the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ in use Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts to create opportunities for even more children to hear and experience Good News and great joy. *Name changed for security

I am writing this while awaiting my departure from California following the Southern Baptist Convention. The SBC is alive and well and actively advancing the gospel of Jesus Christ! We have a few crazy uncles and we don't all have the same approaches or views but we are still a

wonderful family! I'll give more of an report at a soon -to-be-scheduled Family Meeting. However, for this article, I want to share a beautiful moment and thought.

Have you ever wanted a second chance at something? Have you ever looked back and wished a clock could be rewound and a choice or an experience could be redone differently? Maybe a poorly timed word or a painfully damaging action? I think we could all look back with regret at many instances.

I had a big one right before coming to California. Just two days before my trip, I was umpiring a youth baseball double header and forgot to leave my phone in the car. I had it in my pocket... and the screen was facing my leg...and...yep!...my screen was locked up! My leg tried to punch in the passcode after the one minute lockout.

UNSUCESSFUL. Said leg tried again after five and fifteen minutes. Now it was permanently locked!! My phone had tried to warn me throughout the games with notifications but I was not paying the selfish device the attention it demanded. So it threw the ultimate temper tantrum and locked me out permanently! My only option was to erase it and start over.

So the day before my trip I went through the very painful and frustrating process of trying to find some way around the lockout. Finding none, I did the erasure and LOST....EVERYTHING! All of my photos. All of my contacts. All of my travel information! EVERYTHING!!! I cried because of the

overwhelming loss, stress, and mountain of restoration that had to be done in a short time before my trip.

Now, some of you may have already solved my problem, ready to advise me to simply restore it from backup. Yeah,...that's where I wish I could have gone back for a second chance. TWICE in the last 2 weeks I had the thought cross my mind (Holy Spirit, maybe?) to do a backup and I failed to get it done. My last one was in 2019. Not helpful.

Oh the grief! Oh the regret! Oh the futility of wishing for a second chance!

But last night in California I did get to experience a beautiful second chance. My first trip to Anaheim was my senior year of high school. I was competing in the National Future Business Leaders of America competition. I finished first in the Kansas state FBLA in the Accounting 1 competition. (I know, pastor couldn't be that smart!). The night before my competition others from my group were going to the beach and my teacher invited me to go along. I told her I was going to stay and get ready for my test. She offered again, telling me we came all this way and I might not get another chance to see the Pacific Ocean. She predicted I might regret it later. She was right on all accounts. (Get it?? Accounting champ, yet failing here!!??).

But last night, I got that second chance! After the convention was over I went the 13 miles to the beach and had such a beautiful experience! I had soooo regretted that loss for 35 years!! I was moved to tears of a different kind than those of frustration and pain! It was beauty beyond description, leaving a desire to stay in that moment for the rest of my life!

The Deacons' Corner

Greetings Church Family: I hope this newsletter finds all of you well and enjoying your hot Kansas summer. The Lord is good to us, knowing that our fields and yards needed His precious moisture and our local ranchers needed their ponds filled. Our abundant rains from May and early June have given way to the predictable Kansas summer heat. Though we may not appreciate the summer heat as much as the cool pleasant weather of Spring, scripture reminds us to Rejoice in the Lord always. Aren't you glad of His faithfulness to us?

The past few months, I have attempted to share with the church family a little about the deacon body at FSBC. You have hopefully seen our family lists associated with each of our deacons. If your name is missing, let me know to get you and your family added. The deacons want to make sure everyone has a deacon contact that they can easily reach if there is a personal or family need that the church can help with.

Some of you may be new to our church or new to the concept of what deacons do or how these men are chosen. The Bible presents the scriptural qualifications of a deacon in 1 Timothy 3:8-13.

8 In the same way, deacons are to be worthy of respect, sincere, not indulging in much wine, and not pursuing dishonest gain. 9 They must keep hold of the deep truths of the faith with a clear conscience. 10 They must first be tested; and then if there is nothing against them, let them serve as deacons.

11 In the same way, the women are to be worthy of respect, not malicious talkers but temperate and trustworthy in everything.

12 A deacon must be faithful to his wife and must manage his children and his household well. 13 Those who have served well gain an excellent standing and great assurance in their faith in Christ Jesus.

The men of our church who currently serve in the role of deacon take these scriptural qualifications very seriously. The calling of a deacon is not just a job, but it is a commitment to serve, and one that is not taken lightly. The following profile introduces you to another of the deacons at FSBC, Joe Leibbrandt.
