### Pastor's Pen

#### **Frustrated Families and Angry Anthropods**

Greetings Church! I love you Church!

Have you noticed that nearly everyone seems to be getting more angry lately? With the rising gas prices and the accompanying inflation, political division with all its ugliness and terrifying portents, personal disappointments with their lingering stressors, and the news cycle with its co-conspirator Twitterverse exasperating all these and more, Satan is having such a heyday that even faithful believers are becoming discontented and frustrated to the point of giving up or not treating others the way God would have them. Add to the mix a lengthy separation from personal contact in which we must be disciplined to interact peaceably has gotten us addicted to social media. We can lash out anonymously and the result appears to be that *anger* is the new pandemic. But why?

Blogger and former pastor Carey Nieuwhof suggests these as some of the reasons for the new anger epidemic:

- 1. You are naturally more aggressive online than you are in person. Distance desensitizes.
- Hate generates more clicks than love. Media knows how to play on our anxiety and fears too!
- Any attention can feel better than no attention. Just ask an expert: teenagers deal with it every day.
- 4. You know enough to make your world feel dark. The flood of information we deal with today is more than any humans have ever had to endure before. This glut of processing information is making us cynical. Remember when ignorance was bliss?
- 5. Anger can get you heard, even when you have nothing to say. Shouldn't there be a better way to remember we are not alone? That we are loved?

Getting angry and lashing out serves Satan, not Jesus. God tells us through Paul, "in your anger do not sin." It is completely human and understandable that we all get frustrated and angry at things once in a while. Rarely is our anger a righteous anger. And as James tells us, "Man's anger does not bring about the righteousness of God." If I am going to represent Christ well, anger is my enemy. I can't even scold my kids into behaving well, let alone the rest of this evil world! (Did that seem like frustration coming out? Oops!)

One thing we often don't talk about is how our frustration with the outside world negatively affects our homes. Contrary to what we may wish, we are not good at leaving our anger on the doorstep. Rather, our mood is not soothed by the challenges and tasks we face in the home environment. How then does that affect our relationships with those closest to us? Likely in such a way that bad habits form until deep repairs are made.

Beginning this month, I am starting a new series, "The Happier Home." We are going to look to God's Word for encouragement and strength to help our marriages, parenting, and other household struggles. We need less anger, more love. Less conflict, more peace. Less selfishness, more grace. Less me, more us.

Would you get someone to join us in the journey? We all need to do our part to get more Jesus into the lives of those around us. If we don't, we are just going to get more frustrated.
