Greetings Church! I love you church! And I am so proud of all of you who worked together the last few months to pull off an AMAZING Wild Game Feast outreach just over a month ago! Some highlights surrounding the event include:

- Even before the event was here, a group of people started planning and working together to do something for their church that was bigger than anything we have done together in recent years. Some on the team had not been in a leadership role at FSBC ever or in a long time. They worked tirelessly and with beautiful attitudes. It reminds me of how Heaven views the faithful service of God's children as beautiful and a song of praise. Paul alludes to it in his prayer for the Romans in 15:5-6: ⁵ Now may the God who gives endurance and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, according to Christ Jesus, ⁶ so that you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ with one mind and one voice.
- About 30 of our people were present and working hard to prepare, cook, serve, and clean. You were all amazing! We even received a great compliment from the facility management: "You did one of the best cleaning jobs we have ever seen."
- Those of you who took tickets to people you know did a great job! We did very little advertising. Most of the people there came because YOU talked to them! Our attendance statistics were:
 - We had more than 200% of our Sunday worship attendance
 - Depending on who counted and when, between 160 and 200 people were there, plus not a few deer, a mountain lion, elk, and bison. It was amazing how well behaved all the animals were, even the live snakes. By the way, mad props to Kevin Tarrant and Ken Gray for their taxidermy prowess!
 - 13 people indicated that they had trusted
 Christ that night as their personal savior! We

are following up with each one to help them get started in their relationship with Jesus!

- Over 80 door prizes were given away. Thousands of dollars worth of donations made the prizes. A fun time was had by all, which was part of our mission to provide a great experience.
- We had a few competitions during dinner to pass the time and add to the experience. Some youth participated in an antler-rattling contest. It was made more fun as the Thiessen girls took a turn and "cuted" the crowd. Steve Rhodes stole the show in the turkey calling contest as he stood next to me and said, "Here, David, David, David!" I don't get it.
