# The Pastor's Pen

All (hands on deck) Aboard! Greetings, Church! I love you, Church!

The most important outreach of our calendar year is upon us. Many of us can recall our childhood days at Vacation Bible School as one of the most significant events to contribute to our saving faith in Jesus Christ. We learned some great Bible stories, made some crafts that made it all the way through our childhood, sang songs we still rehearse whenever a certain Bible passage is read, and learned to believe in a Jesus who loves us. What great days those (were) ARE for the children of our city!

It has been a few years since our church has been able to host a week-long VBS. We had to succumb to a pandemic, changes in leadership, and insufficient registration. How excited we are to have a new and enthusiastic leader in Paula Moore! Her energy, bubbling from her love for Jesus and children, is contagious! Has it spread to you yet?

I hope it has. For our little church to pull off a daytime VBS we need everyone's help. We need YOUR help! This is our biggest evangelism effort all year and it will take everyone in your church working together to reach children for Jesus! So let us not offer our Lord any excuses for not doing at least one thing to help. Merely being unmotivated or unasked, busy with the affairs of this world, or not knowing how to serve are excuses I don't want to give Jesus for why I didn't help your church with this outreach. We can even find ways around having to work a 9-5 job that week to find opportunities to invest the Gospel into these kids leading up to and following June 5-9. You can visit the homes of families we come to know that week to get to know them and invite them into greater connection with God and your church. You can prepare food in advance, or donate items from our needs list.

We are part of this church together for God's purposes. God has roles for you to fill to grow it. Will you accept your ticket and get on board?



By the way, another great way to help grow your church is to help our new visitation team call upon people. You can let Karen Drake know that you want to help make visitors feel welcomed or visit nursing homes and shut-ins or encourage those attending frequently to become more involved or trying to share

Jesus with lost people in our neighborhood.

By the other way, I want to encourage you to participate in a gospel outreach to the attendees of a drag queen party being hosted in our city June 17. There will be several churches working together on this project and we need prayer warriors more than anything. Church Relations Team
Members form relationships with local
Christian congregations to:

- Inspire them to catch the Great Commission vision of Operation Christmas Child to spread the Gospel to the ends of the earth.
- Mobilize and equip them to participate or increase their participation in the project.
- Encourage them to use the project as a way to share the Gospel locally as they promote community shoebox packing involvement.

Do you have the gift of planning? Then become a Logistics Team Member.

Logistics Coordinators and Dropoff Locations work together to:

- Support and expand shoebox gift collection in their communities.
- Ensure an inviting and efficient

collection of shoebox gifts that serves as • a Gospel witness to the community.

 Assist in goal development and growth planning for area shoebox collection efforts.

Do you love to intercede in prayer? Then become a **Prayer Team Member.** 

Prayer Team Members encourage local individuals, churches, and groups to provide intercessory prayer through:

- Recruiting local prayer team members and enlisting local church support.
- Distributing ministry prayer requests among the team and other area prayer partners.
- Sharing prayer needs and promoting participation at community events, shoebox drop-off locations, churches, and other local gatherings.

Do you like to help get teams organized? Then become an Administrative Support Team Member.

Administrative Support Team Members use their organizational skills

to:

- Manage data and resources for an Area Team.
- Field local inquiries, connecting people to the appropriate team members and project resources.
- Organize and update Area Team information, including meeting minutes, team rosters, and local volunteer contacts.

Do you enjoy meeting new people? Then become a Community Relations Team Member.

Community Relations Team Members are ambassadors for Operation Christmas Child in their communities to:

- Engage and equip businesses and civic organizations to become actively involved in the project.
- Speak to community groups about the project.

 Host or participate in events to spread the word about Operation Christmas Child.

Do you like to spread the word about shoebox gifts? Then become a Media Support Team Member.

Media Support Team Members promote the message of Operation Christmas Child in their communities by:

- Publicizing the ministry through local print and radio outlets.
- Sharing stories of local involvement and coordinating area media coverage of them.
- Providing promotional resources to encourage community participation in the project.

Do you have a heart for outreach to students? Then become a **Student Relations Team Member.** 

Student Relations Team Members engage young people to participate in the project through:

- Speaking to local schools, universities, and student organizations about how to be involved in Operation Christmas Child.
- Coordinating local student-focused project events such as ministry fairs, multimedia presentations, and packing parties.

Encouraging local campuses, organizations, and businesses to partner with students in shoebox packing efforts


