The Pastor's Pen

Greetings Church! I Love You Church!

I have been thinking about our usefulness. We all want our lives to count for something. No one wants to live a meaningless life. Yet, as I get older, I become more and more aware of the struggle many an aging person has with a perceived loss of usefulness. The body weakens. The mind dulls some. Productivity feels like it passed away with the previous decade. The question of usefulness becomes a nagging assault to peace of mind and contentment. New questions arise, such as:

What am I good for?
Why am I still here?
Am I any good to anybody anymore?
What can I even do anymore?
Why doesn't God just take me home?

I have noticed that this struggle is particularly keen to the aging man. We have been wired to base our worth on our strength and work and productivity. It often pains a man to admit his need and ask for help. One man who has voiced the above questions to me often lately is our beloved Austin. We all know of the strokes he had a few years ago. We've all witnessed the weakness and instability in his walk the last year. We are saddened by his worsening condition, but not nearly as discouraged as he. He used to teach Sunday School for over 20 years for adults with disabilities. He studied and taught the Bible diligently and knew it well. The stroke robbed him of the recall of most of what he spent most of his life learning. I have heard him weep over the loss and rejoice when a scripture of the sermon fired up those memories such that he knew what the preacher was talking about! He keeps asking, "What can I do?"

Scripture places a high value on the aged in the church. Young men are instructed to honor our elders. Elders are instructed to instruct our younger men and women in the faith. They are to model for us grace and faith and faithfulness to our Lord. They are to disciple us to follow Jesus. But how does someone who cries out to God every night the questions above find a place in the church to do these things? Sometimes it truly is hard to see the possibilities.

Austin showed us one possibility recently. Those attending worship on July 16 were able to witness some amazing beauty as God provided an answer to Austin's prayers. Following a sermon in which we were challenged to respond to the Spirit's call to come, Austin stumbled into the aisle to come forward because his Savior was calling him to! He started to fall and others stepped up to help him. He made it down to me and weepily said "Pastor, I'm tired." He loves his Savior. He loves his church. He grieves for his condition. We prayed a prayer of love and trust in his very familiar Jesus that moved even me to tears. He sat down with the help of others and cried out, "What can I do?" God gave me the insight to say, "Perhaps you just did it!"

Because we all need to respond to the Spirit whenever He calls! We don't need to let an aging body or mind, nor an imagination of what others might think, nor a failure, nor a wound, nor a past, nor any other excuse stop us from coming to meet with Jesus when the Spirit says come. Austin showed us the only thing we need: a heart that is willing to say yes! I am grateful for Austin's heart which the stroke has not touched. I am grateful for the lesson his example taught me. God is not done with Austin. Or me. Or you.

Perhaps you would like an adventure that will make you feel more useful than you ever imagined! Our association of churches is doing another mission trip to Mexico this November. If you want to go, I'll go with you. Information is in this newsletter. Talk to me about it.

The Deacon's Corner


The Deacon's Corner
