Greetings Church! I love you Church! (Aloha and Aloha Church!)

Thank you so much for allowing me to take some time away for a vacation with Lisa to Hawaii! We had a wonderful time on one of the most beautiful places on the planet! If you want to be annoyed with pictures from our trip, just ask us! We will be glad to relive the moments at your jealous expense!

But it is good to be back to see what God is going to do in our church! I believe we are nearing a time of growth and impact in our church. Some interesting doors have been opened for us recently that might bear much fruit in the near future. Keep these things in your prayers:

- Years ago, the owner of the property to our immediate north, Mike Glendenning, promised Johnny Mehaffey and others that our church could have first opportunity to purchase that property when Mike was ready to retire. Mike passed away 2 years ago, and his widow reached out to us to inform us she is ready to honor Mike's commitment. On September 10 our church elected a Property Acquisition Team to negotiate and oversee the process should our church decide to purchase the property. That decision must be made by a three fourths majority vote at a congregational meeting. Please pray for that team and our church leaders as we talk through what would be best for our church in this decision.
- Our children and youth kickoffs were September 6th.
 We had 60 kids and adults between them! This is presenting immediate challenges to our transportation program. God is up to something great again this year, and He is proving that He will supply all our needs according to His glorious riches in Christ Jesus. Our sister church in Arkansas City just agreed to sell their van and are making it available to us. It is still very early in the process, but we are negotiating with them as well. More details to come.
- In just a few months, we will be blessed to have 5 infants in our nursery! We want to bless these Fab Five

parents with a great church home in which not only can they grow in their own love for Christ but also rely upon our trustworthy leaders, programs, and materials for their precious children to learn to trust their marvelous Creator and beautiful Savior. We may have to hire some college students to help with our nursery program if we cannot adequately staff with volunteers.

- I have been in conversations with a young man who is currently a worship leader intern at our sister church in Salina about the possibility of him coming to join our ministry here at FSBCED. It is still quite early, but we are farther along than I have been able to get with anyone else prior to him. I will be meeting with him again, so please pray for God's direction!
- While we never want the Body of Christ in El Dorado to suffer division and hurt, there have been a few people from another church in town looking for a place to heal from such conflict in their previous church. I am encouraged that our great church health can be the environment they might need to heal and reengage in the mission of getting the Gospel of Christ to our city.
- We have our Fall Festival / Trunk or Treat in October to build connections with our neighborhood. There are families we can meet and build relationships by simply decorating our vehicles, passing out candy, and engaging in conversations! What a great way for each of us to help build our church family! Please pray for a large reach and impact for this event.

I am so glad to be your pastor and part of what God is about to do here! Let us pray over these and other not-yet-known opportunities before us to be sure we do what God has before us for His glory!

our church family attended leadership training in Coffeyville, KS. I enjoyed the day, as did many others. It was nice to attend training related to each individual's areas of ministry within our church. One particular training that resonated with me was in the area of worship. David Manner, who serves at the state level of the Kansas-Nebraska convention, led the training. He opened his presentation by saying, "Worship doesn't just occur during the time of music within the Sunday morning worship hour." He went on to stress that "worship begins on Monday morning." What an interesting consideration. Essentially, he was saying that we begin preparing for worship and continue in an act of worship from the first day of the week. Many of us begin our day in a quiet time of prayer and Bible Study. This certainly is an act of worship as we meditate on scripture and reflect on what the Lord is teaching us. Worship continues during our day as we honor him by being Christ that appeal to a particular preference?

Last month, several members of -like examples in our workplaces and neighborhoods. When we submit to His will and deny ourselves, we worship. Yet how many of us have only thought of worship as that one hour a week that we set aside on Sunday mornings? I for one was convicted of this truth. I have been guilty of this overly simplistic view of worship. Too many times, I have mistakenly entered our church worship center seeking a meaningful time of worship. My attitude has not been in a proper perspective. I have been guilty of assuming that worship has occurred if I have an emotional response from the experience, and then walked away feeling empty if I didn't get the "warm fuzzies" that I assumed signaled that worship had occurred. David Manner's presentation reminded me that worship is not what we expect to "get", but rather the attitude and actions we exhibit that signal we want to glorify God. Worship is most certainly in the songs that we sing, but is it any less worshipful if we do not sing the songs

Worship also occurs when I bring my tithes and offerings, thanking God for all of His blessings, and trusting that He will continue to provide for all of my needs. Worship occurs when I focus on Spirit filled instruction that is delivered from the pulpit. I glorify God when I block out distractions that would keep me from hearing words from His Holy scriptures that challenge me, rebuke me, correct me, and encourage me. My prayer for myself and for all of you who read my words, is that we would not cease our act of worship at the noon hour on Sunday mornings. My prayer is that we would continue in deliberate worship of our Lord and Savior as we depart into our own circles of life. Worship is not limited to a finite hour on Sunday mornings. It is in everything we do, and Our Lord Savior and Sovereign King most certainly deserves it.

Operation Christmas Child

It is officially the time of year to start thinking

about getting our shoeboxes packed and ready. In September, I went to an OCC kick-off event in Wichita. I got to hear from a young lady, Dania Andraos, from the Middle East, who received a shoebox when she was a child. She grew up within a Christian home, but her family was not accepted in her community because they were followers of Jesus. They were poor and didn't have much. They didn't celebrate birthdays or Christmas with gifts because they didn't have the money. They were a family of prayer and took all their needs and wants to God. One prayer they prayed was for a radio so that they could listen to Christian programing. One day Dania went to a for the kids to experience the love of church gathering and there she received an Operation Christmas Child someone in another country who box. Her mom told her and her brother they had to wait and open at home, which was a 30-minute walk!

Her brother tried to sneak his hand under the lid to try and feel what was inside. When she opened her box, it was filled with school supplies, hygiene items (before they could use the bar of soap, her mom wanted to put it in their clothes for a while so they would smell good), and some toys. There was also a small box in it that had a small personal radio in it. That radio was an answer to their prayers. Dania said she knew God answers prayers, but the radio just solidified it for her. Oh, the power of prayer and a simple shoebox gift!

Each box we pack is a gospel opportunity. Churches, schools, and some orphanages around the world partner with OCC and hold outreach events where they share the gospel and then hand out gift boxes to all the kids. These boxes are a tangible way God. Some even ask, "Why would doesn't even know me give me a gift?" The answer: because we love them like God loves them. They are

then invited to participate in The Greatest Journey, which is a 12-week discipleship program. At the end, they graduate and receive a New Testament in their own language! How cool is that!?

The kids would love to see and hear from the one from whom they got their gifts. Thanks again for all your help. Our packing party is scheduled for November 1st. If you can't make it and would still like to participate, here are a couple alternatives:

- 1. Pack a shoebox on your own. If you need some guidance or a box, let me know, and I can help.
- 2. Build a box online at www.samaritanspurse.org/buildabox. We will once again serve as a dropoff location for Shoeboxes. The dates for that are November 13th-20th. Mon 13th -- Friday 17th 5-7 pm, Saturday 18th 10am-1pm, Sunday 19th 2pm-5pm, and Monday the 20th 8-10 am.
