## Pastor's Pen

I write this article having just returned from the Church Forward Conference, or the annual meeting of the Kansas/Nebraska Convention of Southern Baptists in Omaha, Nebraska, as a delegate from our church. I always enjoy getting to go to be inspired by some great preaching and teaching, sharing hugs with my many friends and fellow pastors in our convention (I saw two of your previous pastors: Bobby Payne and John Harms), and looking for direction through the resources that God may lead us to use in the future. Thank you for sending me! I pray that much fruit will come of it in our future together!

I thought I would report some of the highlights so you could keep informed about the larger work of our church through cooperation with our sister churches.

- First, the greatest news at the convention: Baptisms in our churches were up 250% in 2022 from 2021! We were 3<sup>rd</sup> from last in our state conventions in 2021 for per-capita baptisms, ahead of only Canada and California. In 2022 we were second from the top behind only New Mexico! We agreed we wanted to overtake them this year! Regardless, praise God for this beautiful impact of our churches in the Kingdom of Christ!
- We welcomed two new churches to our convention.
- The biggest news from the conference was the rollout of our convention's very own Church Guard resource. Church Guard is an online toolbox to help prevent unwanted sexual behaviors and to know how to proceed when something inappropriate happens. Whether you are a church leader, attendee, family member, or victim-survivor, there are links to take you to information and resources specific to your unique situation. I encourage all of us to look at what we can do to prevent sexual abuse in our church on kncsb.org/churchguard. Prevention replaces the need for reaction.
- Lifeway is releasing a new digital curriculum for kids and students designed to reach the next generation looking for identity but finding their answers outside of the church. Hyfi digital curriculum flips the script on traditional ministry to give effective tools and strategies to reach the

next generations for Christ. You can see a promo at lifeway.com/en/shop/hyfi

 A group of our sister churches, the Crosspoint group, is working on a new program to develop worship leaders to help with the enormous void of needed church worship leaders. I wrote last month that I was in conversations with a young

man in that development pipeline. He told me a week

before the convention that he was taking a job in that pipeline to help train others and was not interested in coming to us. I inquired about our church partnering in some way with the pipeline program. I received a receptive response from them for further talks on how such a partnership might be possible.  On a personal note, I was elected to the Executive Committee of KNCSB for the next 3 years. I look forward to increasing our connection with the rest of our churches through this opportunity.

# **Operation Christmas Child**

Yay! It is November! This is THE month for OCC. Operation Christmas Child began 30 years ago with a request to fill shoeboxes with gifts for children in war-torn Bosnia. A total of 28,000 shoeboxes were packed and delivered that Christmas. Since then, more than 209 million children in over 170 countries and territories have received a shoebox gift.

All the shoeboxes that have been packed here in the U.S. are collected at local churches (the 3<sup>rd</sup> week in November), then taken to central drop offs. After that they get taken to one of the 8 regional processing centers. Ours go to the Colorado processing


center. Once there, volunteers go through each box to make sure there isn't anything that shouldn't be in the box like war related items, money, liquids, food. Then the boxes are put into cartons specific for each one, like girls 2-4, boys 2-4 and so on. Then they are off to their destination in one of the 170 countries and territories around the world. Shoebox gifts are collected in the U.S., Germany, Switzerland, Austria, Spain, Finland, Australia, New Zealand, and South Korea.

When they get to their country, local churches will use them to reach children in their area for the Lord. They have an outreach event for the kids where they present the gospel and then pass out the boxes along with The every one who has graciously donated Greatest Gift Booklet. (It has been translated into 97 languages with more our boxes. translations in progress) Then they invite the children to come back to participate in The Greatest Journey, a

12-lesson discipleship program. Since 2009, over 1.7 million teachers have been trained to lead more than 35 million boys and girls in the program and 17.4 million children have made decisions for Christ! It is an amazing time for all involved. I have had the opportunity to participate in a few distributions in Ecuador. It is so awesome to see how God uses these simple boxes to reach children around the world and then get to see His tangible love in these simple gifts.

We will be packing our shoeboxes on Wednesday, November 1, at 6:30 in the Fellowship hall. Please come and join the fun. Snacks will be provided. I love this time of year! It is such a great time. I am so thankful for each and items and money for the shipping of


