certainly here! Blanket snowfalls in
October and January and temperatures
hovering around zero are apparent signs
that we are in for a difficult season of
hardship and struggle.

The same can be said for more than just the meteorological conditions. Have you checked the temperature of our nation lately? We are in a winter of the worst kind. Our climate is volatile and threatens our very survival as a nation. Our economic struggles are getting colder. Our minds and sensibilities are going dormant, for we cannot even define what is a woman. The blizzard of the most intense political season is beginning to blow discord and anger all across this landscape for the next 11 months straight! Wild winds have already stirred up so much hate and vitriol that we could reasonably forecast a potential avalanche nearing civil war when whatever losing political party cries out the gunshots of election rigging and fraud. Oh what a wintry year we are facing!

Where will people turn? A majority of our neighbors are surviving inflation with credit cards, which will surely crush them as the debt snowballs. Requests for assistance have increased significantly in our local churches. But how long will the members of those

For those who have learned to trust Jesus with far more than their financial barometer, there is the most beautiful spring waiting to turn full bloom when Jesus Christ comes back to set up His reign on earth! Then, and only then, we will have peace between nations and neighbors. Then, and only then, right will be right and wrong will be eliminated. Then, and only then, all provisions needed will be generously bestowed from Jesus' own benevolent hand.

But that benevolent hand will tragically not be extended to everyone. Only those who have surrendered their

lives to Christ through faith in Him as Lord and Savior can be prepared to get through this coming hard "winter". The difficult days ahead might mean great opportunity for our church to share hope, peace, and faith with our city. Operation Christmas Child

February is a month when people celebrate love due to Valentine's Day.

Through OCC, we can show God's love in a tangible way by packing shoeboxes. Our goal this year is to pack 200 boxes (aka gospel opportunities). To do this, we need to start collecting items now and praying for God to help us provide. This month we are collecting accessories. Please refer to the shopping list below for ideas. Also, don't forget to pick up any hats, gloves, or scarves that you may see on sale. You can always bring these and items from January (hats, gloves, and scarves) any time of the year.

Soon after shoeboxes get distributed, the kids are invited to participate in a 12-lesson discipleship program, The Greatest Journey (TGJ). The Greatest Journey is a course designed for Operation Christmas Child shoebox recipients. Children who participate in the program learn how to follow Christ and share Him with others. As they do, entire families and communities are transformed by the power of the Gospel, and churches are started.

Upon completion of the course, they receive a graduation certificate and a New Testament in their own language. This Bible includes the New Testament and selected Old Testament stories along with a dictionary of Biblical terms and a map of Bible lands. Complete with illustrations, it is often the first copy of God's Word the child, or their family, will own. Family and friends who attend the ceremony hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ. After seeing the transformation in the students, their loved ones' hearts are open to hearing the Good News for themselves. Praise God, many of them come to faith in Christ. Since Operation Christmas Child began in 1993, we praise God that over 50 million boys and girls have been discipled through the Samaritan's Purse program.
