

### The Deacon's Corner

Greetings Church Family,

On Sunday, September 15th, the members of First Southern Baptist Church voted to proceed with the acquisition of the property known as Prospect Baptist Church. On behalf of the Deacon body, I would like to express my sincere thanks to all of you for keeping this big event in the life of our church in your prayers. I know you have been praying and would urge you to remain in prayer about what God would have us do with the property and building. As Pastor David mentioned at the meeting, our church has been praying over this matter for some time now. Over the last few years, the question of whether we should take on the property had been brought up on several occasions within deacon meetings and with our church A team. With the fire in our church and the temporary relocation to the Prospect building while our church is being refurbished, we have had the opportunity to consider this

matter with more conviction and seriousness. I would also add that I do not think it was by any accident that Prospect was made available to us by El Dorado Equip Church. God put the wheels in motion for us to temporarily move into the building and I truly believe that He is not finished with leading us in the direction of what he ultimately would have us do with this ministry tool.

In the weeks preceding this vote, the church continued to pray and fast over what we should do. The church family meeting in July was a key step in this process because it gave your church leadership the opportunity to hear the possibilities. There were many great ideas that were presented. Again, no firm decisions have been made. I firmly believe that God already knows what He would have us do. It is in faith that we join Him in His work. In His time, He will make the plan abundantly clear. When I stood up at the meeting to tell you that there was no arm twisting among the deacon body,

I meant it. There was harmony and peace among the deacons for proceeding forward with this acquisition. The same may be said for the A-Team. Again, it is by no accident that one would witness such unity about an opportunity as big as this.

We prayed that God would lead the charge, and He unified the hearts of the leadership teams to rally around this project. I am excited to see what He will continue to do in our midst. In the meantime, please keep this topic at the forefront of your prayer life. Also keep your eyes and ears open to the pulse of the community of El Dorado. It's possible that you might hear about a ministry opportunity that our church can be a part of that includes the use of a large facility such as the Prospect building. Please share any ideas that the Lord reveals to you.


