## The Pastor's Pen



Greetings Church! I Love You, Church!

And Happy Easter! Or should I say, Happy Resurrection Day? I am not sure if you have heard more discussion these last few years about the beginnings of our Easter and Christmas celebrations, but I have noticed an increase in these debates. People are challenging the integrity of our use of these dates and events for many reasons. At best, they are looking for purity in our faith and practice. At worst, they want to undermine the veracity of our Jesus and faith by pulling a perceived foundation out from underneath our spiritual feet. Is that possible? Do their claims hold historical weight? How should we respond to such questions?

Questions revolve around the reality that there used to be pagan or secular festivals held in those calendrical seasons that we now celebrate Christmas and Easter in the Christian calendar. Christians did, indeed, coopt those festivals for a focus on Jesus. Questioners will state that because those festivals did not have a Christian origin there are several strikes against our celebrations as believers. They will suggest that coopting these festivals demonstrates our church institutions' desire to control the masses, choosing manipulation over authentic persuasion as a means to prop up our supposedly fragile faith and unattractive message. Further, they will say that because we do not know the actual dates of Jesus' birth (it may have likely been in the spring), our Christmas celebration December 25th is illegitimate. They say that Easter is a pagan term that is unfit for Christian use. The same is said of Christmas trees and other decorative practices. The higher criticisms are that our worship practices are tainted, defiled, and undermined by the historical origins and that God is not pleased and we are wrong for utilizing them.

How should we respond? We want to honor Jesus' birth and resurrection because they are truly foundational to our faith. We also want to make Him famous for His great salvific work on the cross. We don't want to be put to shame. We want to advance the Gospel to even those who criticize our practices. So, how should we respond? With truth and victory by faith. Let me give you some pointers.

First, acknowledge the historical facts about the origins of our festivals. The Church certainly did coopt pagan and secular celebrations to make more of Jesus and give its members a righteous reason to celebrate

at the times Satan had the attention. These are facts that we need not shy from, however, because they do not automatically demand the undermining conclusions often made. More about that later.

Second, find out from the detractor why they make their objection. Their motivations may be admirable or adversarial, holy or evil. Your response would vary based on the stance from which they proffer. Antagonists merely want to spout to justify their biases and no response is necessary, only blessings and an offer to discuss further if they want to truly talk about it. Genuine curiosity can be satisfied with acknowledgement of the facts and some basic spiritual truth.

The reality is that none of these coopting practices are any concern for the mature believer in Jesus Christ. Get out your Bible and look up 1 Corinthians chapters 8 and 10. Here we find some great wisdom and instruction about a parallel issue to our holy celebrations: food sacrificed to idols. The key passage is 8:5-6, "<sup>5</sup> For even if there are so-called gods, whether in heaven or on earth—as there are many "gods" and many "lords"—<sup>6</sup> yet for us there is one God, the Father. All things are from him, and we exist for him. And there is one Lord, Jesus Christ. All things are through him, and we exist through him." But read all of both chapters to get the full instruction.

Here is the mature believer's stance: The origins are inconsequential to what we are currently practicing as long as we do not give Satan a foothold into our mindset. We dare not surrender to these challenges if we would be tempted to offer Satan any credit or victory. Jesus wins! He has overcome His enemies of lies and evil! We could celebrate Christmas any time of year and it would not matter as long as we make it all about Jesus. I do not like the commercialization of either holy day. I understand its value to our secular, economic society, but I resist its pressure for the sake of emphasizing Christ. I will eat a chocolate bunny, but I do not ascribe any fuzzy meaning to the Resurrection Day focus I bring to the glorious Easter morning! The Christmas tree, the bunny, the eggs, the dates all mean nothing unless I give them undue importance. I refuse to give Satan back the Christmas tree, the dates, the festivals, or the undermining of my pure worship, which is not based on form but heart. (In addition, I am taking back from Satan the meaning of the rainbow!)

So, Happy Easter, Church! And Happy Glorious Resurrection Day!
