Greetings Church! I love you, Church!
Well, this month we will mark
the one-year anniversary of a little fire
with a big impact on our ministry. It
burned all of 20 minutes on the 24<sup>th</sup>,
the Friday kicking off Memorial Day
Weekend, but the spreading soot
caused damages that lasted for more
than four months.

I don't know about you all, but I don't look very fondly toward this particular anniversary. The challenges it brought

are not high on my celebration list. But shouldn't they be? James 1 tells me to "<sup>2</sup> Consider it a great joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you experience various trials, <sup>3</sup> because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance. <sup>4</sup> And let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking nothing."

While I don't look fondly upon the immediate wave of that fire, there is no doubt that we have much reason to rejoice in what God has done! We have come back from that season to a season of greater blessing and working of God than before all this happened. Souls are being saved! Baptisms are being celebrated! God is bringing new people to our church every Sunday!

Part of the reason God can do these things in us is because so many of us were faithful to pray, encourage, serve, and still love each other in the stressful chaos. We demonstrated unity in the body and we kept our message on our Jesus. We made more of Him than our plight. (Boy, that Philippians journey was spot-on!)
