



# The Pastor's Pen





Happy Summer Church! I love you Church!

Wow! What a difference a year or five or seven makes! One year ago we were wandering through what seemed like a tabernacle haul through a desert land! The great church fire of 2024 is a year in our rear view window and it does us good to take

a look at its place in our church history. But let me jump back a few years, seven to be exact.

This Father's Day marks the end of my seventh year being your pastor. You remember my battle with the Lord about what I thought was His plan for me and how He made absolutely clear that this was where He was sending me to build the kingdom. It was a crucial time in my life and in the life of our church. Almost immediately we started to see steady growth and soon we had begun discussions about what we were going to do about having enough space for worshippers if the trajectory continued.

Then, just as we were getting excited about the future expansion of our ministry, the pandemic put a halt to all our momentum. Attendance and offerings both dropped significantly and we had to respond with concerns about survival. Attendance was down around 60, less than half of what we were peaking. We lost people to the pandemic due to whichever decisions we would make, elderly caution, and even death from the pandemic. We struggled through that very difficult season of about 3 years.

Then momentum began to come back as people returned and ministries started reaching out again.

New people started checking us out. Attendance began to climb again, getting us to almost 90. Then, just as we were getting ready for our largest outreach of the year, a silly fire canceled our Vacation Bible School and put us again on survival watch. Where are we going to meet? How much will this cost? How will we be able to do ministry and grow? How are we going to be able to communicate as a mobile church? There were so very

many questions and challenges.

In spite of the challenges, we kept loving each other and doing ministry as best we could. God provided much in places to meet, shared VBS, and new people finding us even out of our normal place of ministry. In fact, when we came back to our facility in October of 2024, we did so stronger than what we expected! Our attendance from that point has been consistently over 90 as new people we met over the summer transitioned back with us.

Momentum has only been growing since then! Since Easter, we have had two services with at least 131 people here! We are meeting new people every week! Our March new member's class had 7 participants and the upcoming one has 7 more family units expected!

The most glorious part is that the waters of baptism are stirring once again! Since December, (by count at this time of writing,) we have baptized 13 people! Family, that is over 10 percent of our church attendance! And more are already on the way for this summer! God is moving mightily! People are starting again to seek the Lord! The stories of His working are lifting our spirits nearly every week! Could it be that we are on the verge of an awakening in our city? Oh, Heaven, Please!!

The recent workings of God only make me dream for more in the future! I never get tired of being late to sing the songs in worship because I have to get dried off and changed after baptisms. (By the way, hasn't our worship ministry growth been an amazing blessing?) I keep coming to our worship gatherings with great expectations that I will get to see God do something awesome in somebody's life! I am feeling the wonderful pressure to start planning for our future growth again! Do we need to start talking about multiple worship services or a building expansion? Do we need to bring in a youth pastor? What have we not even begun to ask that God will require of us?

Keep praying church! Keep loving each other! Keep inviting! And talk about what God is showing you about what we need to do!

# Operation Christmas Child

Have you ever thought about helping with Operation Christmas Child other than just in November? There are opportunities to help share about this ministry year-round. I serve as a year-round volunteer by coordinating the drop-off at our church, and I am a community relations team member; which reaches out to different community groups and tries to get them involved in packing boxes.

Here are the different roles and a short description of each: Do you jump at the chance to inspire people?

Then become a Leadership Team Member.

Leadership Team Members build local teams of volunteers through:

- Recruiting, selecting, training, and leading volunteers.
- Shepherding and rallying team members.
- Vision casting and coordinating team operations

Do you like to encourage people in churches?

Then become a Church Relations Team Member.

Church Relations Team members form relationships with local Christian congregations to:

- Inspire them to catch the Great Commission vision of Operation Christmas Child to spread the Gospel to the ends of the earth.
- Mobilize and equip them to participate or increase their participation in the project.
- Encourage them to use the project as a way to share the Gospel locally as they promote community shoebox packing involvement.

Do you have the gift of planning? Then become a Logistics Team Member.

Logistics Coordinators and Drop-off Locations work together to:

- Support and expand shoebox gift collection in their communities.
- Ensure an inviting and efficient collection of shoebox gifts that serves as a Gospel witness to the community.
- Assist in goal development and growth planning for area shoebox collection efforts.

Do you love to intercede in prayer?

Then become a Prayer Team Member.

Prayer Team Members encourage local individuals, churches, and groups to provide intercessory prayer through:

- Recruiting local prayer team members and enlisting local church support.
- Distributing ministry prayer requests among the team and other area prayer partners.
- Sharing prayer needs and promoting participation at community events, shoebox drop-off locations, churches, and other local gatherings.

Do you like to help get teams organized? Then become an **Administrative Support Team Member.** Administrative Support Team Members use their organizational skills to:

- Manage data and resources for an Area Team.
- Field local inquiries, connecting people to the appropriate team members and project resources.
- Organize and update Area Team information, including meeting minutes, team rosters, and local volunteer contacts.

Do you enjoy meeting new people?

Then become a **Community Relations Team Member**.

Community Relations Team Members are ambassadors for Operation Christmas Child in their communities to:

- Engage and equip businesses and civic organizations to become actively involved in the project.
- Speak to community groups about the project.
- Host or participate in events to spread the word about Operation Christmas Child

Do you like to spread the word about shoebox gifts?
Then become a Media Support Team Member.
Media Support Team Members promote the message of Operation Christmas Child in their communities by:

- Publicizing the ministry through local print and radio outlets.
- Sharing stories of local involvement and coordinating area media coverage of them.
- Providing promotional resources to encourage community participation in the project.

Do you have a heart for outreach to students?
Then become a **Student Relations Team Member**.
Student Relations Team Members engage young people to participate in the project through:

- Speaking to local schools, universities, and student organizations about how to be involved in Operation Christmas Child.
- Coordinating local student-focused project events such as ministry fairs, multimedia presentations, and packing parties.
- Encouraging local campuses, organizations, and businesses to partner with students in shoebox packing efforts.


